The longer the skins remain in contact with the juice the darker the pink hue the wine is left with. The dryness or sweetness of the wine is mostly attributed to the variety of grapes used. And most Rosé wines are made from a variety of grapes. France remains the largest producer of Rosé followed by Spain, Italy and California. We have listed for some time now one of the great bottlings of this versatile wine. Caves D'Esclans Whispering Angel is a delicious, dryer style Rosé from Provence, France, arguably the best region in the world for Rosé production. You can start with this one, and as we discover a few more pink gems, you will be the first to know. Cheers!
